LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

A BETTER WORLD IS POSSIBLE

WHAT IS THE EUROPAMUNDO FOUNDATION. ALLIANCE BETWEEN NGO AND COMPANY

EUROPAMUNDO FOUNDATION (FEM) is a private, non-profit organisation with its own legal character and full capacity to act. The will of its creators, Europamundo Vacaciones (EMV), is to realise the purposes of general interest set out in its statutes.

FEM works to promote coexistence and understanding between cultures seeking a more tolerant and diverse world, by favouring the use and enrichment of the cultural heritage of humanity and especially fostering tourist awareness among the peoples of the world as a strategy of development through Sustainable Tour-

ism. With the Global Compact, it works for the elimination of poverty, the fight against climate change and the reduction of inequality, through the United Nations 2030 Agenda, its 17 Sustainable Development Goals and the 169 associated goals. With the UNWTO, it collaborates in the ST-EP initiative (Responsible and Sustainable Tourism for the Elimination of Poverty) created at the World Summit on Sustainable Development in Johannesburg in 2002.

This Foundation is mainly funded by its parent company EMV and the employees of Europamundo Vacaciones through its Operators, Suppliers, Travel Agents, Partners and Personnel of the Company, as well as indirectly through all of the passengers on the circuits of Europamundo Vacaciones. Europamundo Vacaciones allocates 2 euros to its Foundation for each passenger that does an EMV circuit, to support the projects of the NGOs that are presented in the annual call.

Through its Foundation, Europamundo Vacaciones launches its eighth call for the 2018 FEM Fund, in September 2018, a social fund aimed at supporting activities to improve the living conditions of people by collaborating in creating a more sustainable, diverse and tolerant world.

It is in the FEM's general interest to carry out activities of social action and cooperation for the development of particularly vulnerable zones and sectors of the population, both in Spain and in other countries, and to promote sustainable human development.

The bases of the call detail the criteria and requirements that the Europamundo Foundation Evaluation Committee considers in awarding of economic subsidies to the different projects presented. The amount that the Europamundo Fund put aside for this purpose was €243,900.

The Evaluation Committee formed at the request of the General Manager of Europamundo Vacaciones S.L. is responsible for choosing the beneficiaries, among all the projects received each year in the call made in September, of the Europamundo Foundation Fund, and which are financed and carried out in the year after the call.

The activity of the Europamundo Foundation throughout the year 2018 by geographical area, sector and population was as follows;

The projects of the Europamundo Foundation are geographically distributed as follows:

Latin America: 47.20% with 7 projects. Asia: 12.40% with 3 projects. Africa: 18% with 3 projects. Europe 18.20% with 6 projects and the New East: 4.10% with 1 project. By sectors of action:

Tourism: 13.60% with 3 projects. Social Action: 33% with 7 projects. Health: 18.60% with 3 projects. Education: 26.60% with 5 projects. Humanitarian Aid: 4.10% with 1 project. Infrastructures: 4.10% with 1 project.

By sector of population:

General Population: 47.20% with 7 projects. Youth: 11.10% with 5 projects. Minors: 10.20% with 2 projects. Women: 25.20% with 4 projects. Refugees: 4.10% with 1 project and Home-less: 2.20% with 1 project.

Number of beneficiaries.

In the period 2011-2018, 124 projects were carried out with a total of 202,345 direct beneficiaries we supported in 25 countries around the world, and work was done with 43 NGOs. In 2018, 20 projects, with 15,496 direct beneficiaries, were carried out in 15 countries: in Latin America in Bolivia, Mexico, Argentina, Nicaragua, Peru and Colombia; in Africa in Morocco, Kenya, Mali and Cabo Verde; in Asia in India, Nepal and Jordan, and; in Europe in Greece and Spain.

The Europamundo Foundation develops four strategic lines of action:

1. PROJECTS. Following the life cycle of the project, they are presented to the call, selected, financed, carried out, followed up on and finally the results are assessed.


2. RELATIONSHIP WITH STAKEHOLDERS.

The Foundation seeks collaboration between the entity and the different stakeholders such as the employees of EMV, its collaborators, customers, suppliers and partners, in the financing of projects, and through their volunteering.

3. VOLUNTEERING.

- *Training.* "I deserve a chance" programme by the Randstad Foundation.
- **Collaborative.** A programme of Homeless People with the Supportive for Development, Dance and Theatre association for young disabled, with the NGO Dan Zass, and with the Oxiria Foundation and its Guau programme, for activities with young disabled and therapy dogs.
- *International.* International volunteering programme in Bolivia, Nepal, India, Kenya, Argentina, Ecuador and Honduras.
 - 4.OTHER SOCIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL ACTIVITIES. Social and environmental awareness activities among Europamundo employees, collaborators and some of their stakeholders.

PROJECTS

Following its main strategic line of action, which is the financing of projects, the Europamundo Foundation launches an annual call with a project selection process. Their subsequent funding over a year through the development of the project life cycle, which is described below.

Project life cycle.

A summary is made of the phases of the project presented to the annual call of the Europamundo Foundation.

- Call. We start with the Call made on 1 September every year.
- Reception of the Call. The entities, NGOs, have to deliver the projects before 30 September on the provided template number 1 "fund application", template no. 2 "project description" and no. 3 "project budget".
- Valuation of the projects. From 1 October until 31 January, the Evaluation Committee meets to assess the projects received.
- Notification of selected and non-selected projects. On 1 February, the projects selected and not selected are notified to the social entities.

Several documents are sent to the Entities of the selected projects: letter of acceptance, form with the bank account data signed by the entity and the bank, monitoring report form, final report form and informative document on the "project life".

The entities that have to rearrange their projects are given 10 days to do so; they send the rearranged project and the Evaluation Committee decides.

- Letter of acceptance. After 15 days of sending the acceptance letter and bank data, the first 50% of the amount awarded for the project is sent by bank transfer.
- They have a time of 2 months to start the Project.
- Follow-up report. Six months after the project begins, the entity sends us the follow-up report and, after positive evaluation by the Evaluation Committee, the second 50% of the amount awarded for the project is delivered.

The follow-up report is a report on the performance of the project and the achievement of the planned objectives, and this and the expenses must be made approximately 50%.

• *Final report.* The follow-up report is a report on the performance of the project and the achievement of the planned objectives, and this and the expenses must be made approximately 50%.

The final report is detailed in two aspects: the technical with the activities carried out and the goals achieved according to the project, and an economic analysis with the detail of the expenditure and the bills justifying the expense.

- Field trip. Between the follow-up report and the final report, a field trip could be made to the project through some of the collaborators, colleagues from the office or guides of Europamundo Vacaciones, the parent company of the Europamundo Foundation, who may be close to the area where the project is made.
- Evaluation. One of the members of the Evaluation Committee assesses the Project through his final report.

The analysis is technical, to verify the objectives reached according to the original project, and economic to verify the expenditure made and the invoices justifying said expense.

• **Communication.** The project is assessed and the result is sent to the entity through a report.

The total time that these phases of the project takes is close to 2 years.

In the projects that are not of continuity, a periodic check of the sustainability of the project will be made over time, by contacting the entity that drew it up and carried it out.

Project selection process

The awarding procedure will be by comparing the applications submitted in time and the terms and conditions of the fund with a criterion of priority between them, and those achieving the highest score will be awarded, according to the criteria established in the fund terms and conditions.

QUANTITATIVE ASSESSMENT CRITERIA AND SCORE.

The assessment and scoring, up to a maximum of 100 points, will be made according to the following criteria:

- 1.Assessment criteria and weighting of the same, of the REQUESTING ENTITIES up to a maximum of 15 points.
- 2.Assessment criteria and weighting of the same, of the REQUESTED PROJECTS up to a maximum of 85 points.
- 3. The evaluation committee may apply qualitative criteria, complementing the quantitative, for the selection of those projects they understand to be important, necessary or sustainable over time for their Foundation.

HEALTH ASSISTANCE IN THE INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF BENI.

The project aims to create and consolidate a self-sustaining health system in the poorest and most deprived areas of the Bolivian jungle. Expeditions are made to the most remote communities where the people are trained in basic health issues by qualified volunteers who make supportive trips to Bolivia and, as they train, they take basic kits to the communities.

Direct beneficiaries: 18,000 people **Population of the area of influence:** 40,000 people **Geographic Area:** Department of Beni. Bolivia **Duration:** 12 months



SCHOOL BUS.

Most of the children come from mountain villages and many of them have to walk more than two hours to get to school. Having a bus to pick up these children and many others would greatly ease the problem of their education.

BASIC ASSISTANCE FOR FAMILIES OF SYRIAN REFUGEES IN CAMPS AND URBAN AREAS OF JORDAN.

The aim of this project is to contribute to the process of international protection of the Syrian refugee population residing in the Zaatari and Azraq camps and in the urban areas of the Amman governorate, by ensuring their access to emergency services.

Direct beneficiaries: 1,375 people, Indirect beneficiaries: 79,558 people

EMERGENCY ROOM PHOTOVOLTAIC EQUIPMENT.

The construction of the Emergency Room is currently under way to provide 24/7 healthcare to critical patients or those who need monitoring.

Once the construction is finished, in the following months of 2017, we will start equipping the unit. In order to supply the complex with electricity, we need to buy solar panels since, in Turkana, this is the most efficient way to obtain it.

ACAHUAL HEALTH ATTENTION AND PROMOTION CENTRE

The Acahual Centre will hire a woman doctor who will work in a clinic 45 hours a week from Monday to Friday, not public holidays, and on Saturdays will perform colposcopy, cauterisation, cryotherapy and or biopsies. This assistance is provided for women in the district of Acahualinca and surrounding areas, as well as their children.

BUILDING FOOTPRINTS II: training and personal development of minors at risk of exclusion

for job placement in responsible tourism.

"BUILDING FOOTPRINTS II" is based on a need detected in the area of action in which school children have a low educational level and considerable school failure; basically those in preadolescence and adolescence. The programme consists of support classes in English (official language in the country) and IT (India is the largest producer of software in the world) as well as personal development for future employment in the sustainable and responsible tourism sector.

Direct beneficiaries: 150 minors (70% are women), Indirect beneficiaries: 400 families

NUTRITION AND FOOD SAFETY

The NPH home in Peru takes in 105 children and young people without resources and covers their most basic needs: medical care, food, and education, until they reach legal age and are sufficiently trained (university or technical studies) to become independent, to form their own family and to be examples for their community.

IMPROVEMENT OF EDUCATIONAL SPACES AND THEIR HEALTH CONDITIONS IN THE HOMES OF THE CRECER JUNTOS CENTRE.

Improvement of the 7 Centre Homes managed by Crecer Juntos, with children playing an active role in the transformation of their space. The reforms involve the educational and health spaces. As well as repairing the wear and tear of the families' homes (dining room, kitchen and bathrooms) caused by their continuous use by teachers, helpers and children in the development of educational activities and social care.

The project integrates 300 artisans distributed in 35 Waorani communities that are dedicated to artisanal activity and consists of the realization of specialized training modules in quality improvement, development of new products, participation in fairs, dissemination, marketing, management business and marketing plans in the national and international market







Collaboration agreements

PASOS COOPERACIÓN

Europamundo Vacaciones has renewed the collaboration agreement with the NGO Pasos Cooperación to finance a project of a network of community health volunteers in the Tounfite region, in the Midelt province in the Moroccan Atlas.

The aim is to influence the health of the population of isolated villages without health posts in the Central High Atlas Tounfite Circle at an altitude of between 1800 and 2300 metres, by maintaining a network of "base houses" equipped with health kits for urgent attention, manned by health volunteers.

This project is developed in the Central High Atlas in the villages of the valleys between Tounfite and Imilchil (communes of Agoudim, Sidi Yahya and Anemzi, province of Midelt). It is a high mountain region, with a population of Amazigh language and culture, with an agro-pastoral subsistence economy (agricultural crops and grazing of goats and sheep), although there is a small rural tourism activity, very little developed (also subsistence). There is a very high degree of illiteracy, which is more than 90% in women. There are villages up to 2,200 m altitude, and the climate is very cold in winter, with heavy snowfall that often isolates the population.

The duration of the project is one year beginning in October 2017 and ending in September 2018

ECODES (ECOLOGY AND DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION).

The purpose of this agreement for business collaboration in activities of general interest is to offset 3,937 tons of CO2 through a CeroCO2 compensation project.

The project through which the compensation will be carried out is "CommuniTree-Re-forestación comunitaria en Limay "Nicaragua". The Limay Community Carbon Project is a community reforestation initiative that brings together small farmers in Nicaragua to reforest parts of their disused lands, promoted by the NGO Taking Root. The compensation project has a cost of €10/tCO2eq. And in 2018 they planted around 15,000 trees.

Other activities in 2018

INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEERING.

The Europamundo Foundation through its fund for the financing of projects in 2018 funded 8 projects in which there is a supportive tourism programme and to which the employees and collaborators of Europa Mundo can go.

The supportive tourism programme is carried out in:

Latin America in the Amazon rainforest of Bolivia with a health project with the NGO Medical Solidarity and an animal recovery project with the NGO Tumaini Travel, in Honduras in Santa Bárbara with a nutrition centre for children with the Share Foundation and in Ecuador in the Amazon rainforest with the Woaranis Women's Association.



In Africa in the northwest of Kenya in Turkana a health project with the Emalaikat Foundation and in Senegal in Faoye, Badian and Seleki with ecotourism camps managed by the NGO Supportive Camps.






COLLABORATIVE CORPORATE VOLUNTEERING

One of the activities of the Europamundo Foundation in which Europa Mundo staff collaborate is volunteering with several socially excluded groups:

CORPORATE TRAINING VOLUNTEERING.

The Europamundo Foundation collaborates with the Randstad Foundation in a "I deserve a chance" project to seek employment for people over 45 in long-term unemployment. This project is supported out by staff from Europa Mundo who give training workshops on Sales, Motivation, Finance, Social Networks, How to present oneself at an Interview and Customer Service.

THEMATIC TUESDAYS FROM NOVEMBER TO MARCH

From the Europamundo Foundation and following the commitment that Europa Mundo has with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), it is developing the "thematic Tuesdays": monthly talks with Social Entities on any of the SDGs.

In November, an informative talk was given by the two students with intellectual disability of the Oxiria Foundation: Macarena and Sergio, accompanied by Ana Arroyo, founder of the Foundation, speaking about what the Oxiria Foundation is and what they study in it.



In December it was the turn of the Emergency Head of Action Against Hunger, Victor Velasco, who addressed what work is like in an emergency response (travel, accommodation and meals for staff, logistics of the necessary materials to face the situation, communications, etc.).



FOOD COLLECTION CAMPAIGN, WOMEN AND BABY CLOTHING, TOYS AND TALES.

During the first fortnight of December in the offices of Europa Mundo, a campaign was carried out to collect women's and babies' clothes, toys, food and stories in which more than 60 colleagues from Europe World participated and delivered material among the following entities:

- Fundación Madrina: clothes, food, toys and tales.
- Victoria Association against gender violence and the entity Hoy por ti: clothes, food and toys.
- Urban Angels Association: food and clothing
- Parish of San Ramón Nonato, food, clothes and tales.



ACTION AGAINST HUNGER CHARITY RACE.

Every year in October, Action against Hunger organises a charity race for companies in which the proceeds are used to fight combat malnutrition of children under 5 years old.

In 2018, 24 members of the Europamundo took part in Madrid.



CAP COLLECTION CAMPAIGN.

The Europamundo Foundation each year organises the collection of plastic bottle caps among all the workers of the offices of its parent company Europa Mundo Vacaciones, and also with the special collaboration of some fellow guides. These are used to finance diseases or costly operations.

BLOOD DONATION.

In the month of October, in Europa Mundo a blood donation was organised in which 35 people from the Madrid office and guides took part. The blood was taken by the street team of the Spanish Red Cross of Madrid.

DONATION OF COMPUTERS.

Through its IT department, Europa Mundo donates computer equipment and screens that are renewed every 6 years to certain NGOs.

In 2018 a donation was made to the NGO Solidaridad Médica of 2 computers, and 7 screens that will be used at the Pasacana health centre in San Ignacio de Moxos, Beni department in Bolivia.

WORLD TOURISM ORGANISATION ETHICS AWARD

The jury of the UNWTO Ethics Prize, made up of members of the <u>World Tourism Ethics</u> <u>Committee</u>, chose Europa Mundo Vacaciones as the winner of this second edition of the Awards, for its "Europa Mundo Foundation" initiative

The prize-giving was held on 17 January 17 at the IFEMA Auditorium with the second edition of the Ethics Award of the World Tourism Organisation by the Vice-president of the World Tourism Ethics Committee to our Europamundo CEO, Luis García Codron

SPECIAL FUND FOR RARE DISEASES.

The Europamundo Foundation in 2018 set up a special fund to help research into rare diseases.

This help was for the Prader Willi Syndrome Association and for the scientific congress for the Congenital Multiple Arthrogriposis Association.

EMERGENCY FUND

Since its creation, the Europamundo Foundation has had an emergency fund that it has activated 30 times since 2011. In 2018, it made 3 fund activations in the following campaigns:

- Syrian refugees cold campaign
- Campaign for the fire volcano
- Earthquake in Haiti.



STUDY GRANTS

The Europamundo Foundation in 2018 gave a study grant equivalent to 4 months for the training of a student of the Oxiria Foundation.

The Oxiria Foundation provides vocational training for employment in commercial management and auxiliary florist activities for students with intellectual disabilities over 18 years of age.

GRANTS FOR INTERNATIONAL VOLUNTEERING

In 2018, the Europamundo Foundation launched 2 grants for the trip that 2 of our colleagues will make to Nala (Nepal) in February 2019 as part of the Amavida NGO project with the management of a school with more than 200 boys and girls.

SUPPORT PROJECT FOR THE BARRÓ ASSOCIATION.

In recent years, one of the projects in which the Europamundo Foundation has participated is the financing of some of the regular activities of the Barró Association with its users, adolescents from the Vallecas district in Madrid. This support comes through the concession of buses financed by the Europamundo Foundation, its parent company Europamundo and one of the Eurotrans bus companies.

CHARITY FLEA MARKET

The Europamundo Foundation once again opened its charity flea market coinciding with the start of the Christmas holidays. It invited 5 NGOs: Oxiria Foundation, Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos Foundation, Emalaikat Foundation, the Lights of Hope Association and the Amavida Association that work in Spain, Peru and Haiti, Kenya, India and Nepal.





CHRISTMAS CENTRE WORKSHOP

On 14 December 2018, an Inclusive Workshop of Christmas Centres took place at the Europamundo offices with employees of Europamundo and 8 students with intellectual disabilities in the 2nd year of Floristry Assistant, accompanied by several tutors from the Oxiria Foundation and Ana Arroyo, its founder.

This innovative activity was carried out in a totally inclusive environment where students from the Oxiria Foundation played as teachers and told employees how natural Christmas centres are made.



"BEHIND THE EMERGENCY" EXHIBITION

At the Europamundo office, in December, Action against Hunder's "behind the emergency" exhibition was held with 9 panels showing the work and the difficulties behind an emergency intervention. Logistics, security, psychological stress, coordination ... are the least known part of a huge work that Action Against Hunger deploys every year in between 50 and 65 emergencies around the world, whether they be natural disasters or caused by human action.



"VOLUNTEERS IN EUROPAMUNDO" EXHIBITION

In 2018, around 50 people from the Europamundo staff participated in the different volunteering programmes of the Europamundo Foundation. During the first fortnight of December at the Europamundo office, an exhibition was held with 3 panels of projects in which the Europamundo staff took part.



MANAGEMENT FOR DIVERSITY IN EUROPAMUNDO

Europamundo collaborated with the NGO ACCEM through a European project that it is developing, a Cultural and Ethnic project, its DIVEM project, management for diversity in companies.

Cultural and Ethnic Diversity affects three SDGs: nos. 5, 8 and 17





Call to the Europamundo Foundation Fund 2018.

On 1 September 2018 the annual call was made to the Europamundo Foundation fund for financial assistance to projects submitted by non-profit organisations, as an association, foundation, mutual society, cooperative, congregations or religious entities.

On 30 September, the project delivery deadline was reached and 54 projects were presented from 50 entities and 19 countries: 9 from Latin America, 2 from Asia, 5 from Africa, 2 from the Middle East and 1 from Europe in sectors such as: 8 in Tourism, 9 in Education, 26 in Social Action, 4 in Health, 5 in Infrastructure, 1 in Refugees and 1 in Homeless.

The Europamundo Evaluation Committee, made up of 31 members, will assess the projects before January 31, 2019, following the evaluation criteria attached to the bidding rules.

The projects chosen will be financed until the fund runs out throughout 2019.

Every year, the Europamundo Foundation launches a call for social and environmental non-profit organisations (NGOs) to present their projects and, after a selection process, following the criteria set out in the terms and conditions, the projects are allocated between \notin 250,000 and \notin 310,000 from a fund that Europamundo Vacaciones donates to the Europamundo Foundation, equivalent to \notin 2 for each passenger travelling on our circuits.
